- On or after 1st August 2019 – no refunds issued - any outstanding amounts will be invoiced.

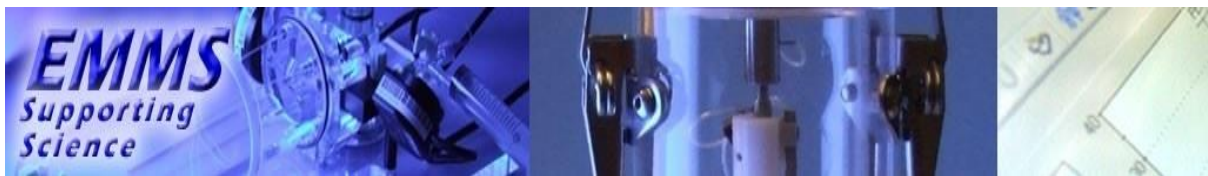
Replacements: Substitutions can be made at any time up to 27th September 2019.

HOW TO GET TO THE GRAND HOTEL, BRIGHTON

BY RAIL

Leave the car at home and go green. There are fantastic rail links into Brighton from throughout the UK. London Services run approximately every 10 minutes and takes just 1 hour from London Victoria, so travelling by rail couldn't be more convenient. The hotel is only 12 minutes' walk from Brighton Railway Station or a couple of minutes in a taxi.

BY BIKE

Cycle parking is available for all hotel guests. Leave your bike safe and secure for FREE at The Grand. If you are using The Grand as a base in which to explore the sights and sounds of Sussex, visit our attractions page for information on suggested cycle routes in and around Brighton.

BY COACH

There are frequent daily services dropping off right in the heart of the city. Daily services from London run every hour and with a stop off point just a 10-minute walk from the hotel, coach travel is a fantastic way to get to us. Visit National Express for full coach timetables.

BY CAR

From London and the M25, take the M23 to Brighton and then the King's Road A259 Seafront Road. The hotel car park is accessed from Cannon Place and has 40 parking spaces available to guests at £35.00 per night available from 3pm on day of arrival and issued on a first come first served basis. On arrival please check with the hotel concierge that there are parking spaces available.

Please note that if you are staying for 3 nights or more the daily rate is £25.

There is also a National Car Park (NCP) directly behind the hotel on Russell Road which has over 500 spaces.

BY AIR

Gatwick Airport is 28 miles away - 45 minutes by taxi. The train from Gatwick Airport to Brighton takes just under 30 minutes.
