Dear Colleagues and Friends,

The European Society of Toxicologic Pathology is pleased to invite you to the 14<sup>th</sup> EUROPEAN CONGRESS OF TOXICOLOGIC PATHOLOGY which will be held at the Avenida Palace Hotel in the city center of Barcelona, Spain from the 20<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> of September 2016.

Plenary lectures, oral presentations, interactive panel discussions and case presentations as well as a poster session will provide opportunity for formal and informal interactions with colleagues and friends. New books, innovative equipment and techniques, and contract research organizations services will be featured at the trade exhibition.

Moreover, as a satellite event, the 5<sup>th</sup> ESTP International Expert Workshop, on the topic “Adversity of Lysosomal Accumulation” will take place after our main meeting at the congress venue and will allow an audience of up to 50 interested registrants.

Barcelona, the second most populated city in Spain and the capital of the autonomous community of Catalonia, is a vibrant and exciting venue for this congress. # Preliminary Program

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## **Tuesday, 20<sup>th</sup> September 2016 (start at 08.30 h)**

IATP session on juvenile toxicity with emphasis on adverse and non-adverse findings.

## **Tuesday, 20<sup>th</sup> September 2016 (start at 13.15 h)**

A keynote on the main theme, adversity and adaptation, will open the congress. It will be followed by the lung session dealing with adversity of pathological findings and lung toxicology in humans related to drugs. New technologies for investigation of adverse pathological findings will conclude this first day.

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## **Wednesday, 21<sup>st</sup> September 2016**

The first session of the day will focus on adversity of preclinical thyroid findings with animal models and translation to human clinical exposure including examples relevant to drug and chemical development and use of clinical pathology in risk assessment.

The second session will continue with kidney and an “INHAND” review focusing on adverse or not adverse findings. It will also include examples from drug and chemical development and translation to humans, followed by an expert panel discussion.

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## **Thursday, 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2016**

Adversity in the lympho-hematopoietic system will be the major topic of this third day with a keynote lecture on stress-related versus compounds effects/adversity. New technologies for investigation of adverse pathological findings in immune system and an interactive session on adversity in clinical pathology will be followed by interactive case presentations to end this day.

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## **Friday, 23<sup>th</sup> September 2016 (morning till 13.00 h)**

The final morning session will be dedicated to presentations of the European and US regulatory perspective of adversity, with a special focus on the topics and organ systems covered during the congress. It will be concluded with an expert panel discussion and interactive case presentations.

## BSTP Chirukandath Gopinath Lecture

The award (engraved glass award), instigated by the British Society of Toxicological Pathology in 2008, was due in part to the BSTP's involvement in the organization of the scientific program of the 2008 Annual ESTP Congress held in Edinburgh. To mark the occasion, the BSTP sponsored the keynote lecture and since then this sponsorship has become a tradition at the ESTP Congresses.

The sponsored lecture was called the BSTP Chirukandath Gopinath Lecture in tribute to one of the founder members of the BSTP whose name is recognized by toxicological pathologists all over the world. The lecture is to be on a topic in pathology relevant to practicing toxicological pathologists. The speaker is an internationally recognized scientist and is chosen by the scientific organizing committee and approved by the BSTP council.

## IATP CHARLES CAPEN TRAINEE AWARD

The Charles Capen Trainee Award given by the **International Academy of Toxicologic Pathology** (IATP) recognizes Dr. Charles Capen and his legacy as a researcher, teacher, and mentor to the pathology and toxicology communities spanning more than four decades. Dr. Capen was recognized worldwide as an exceptional leader in veterinary and biomedical research. He was a highly regarded mentor to numerous graduate students and postdoctoral scientists. His students and trainees are now leaders throughout academia, government and industry.

The Charles Capen Awards provides a classic reference book to the awardee to further his or her training and education in the field of toxicologic pathology.

The successful applicant must be a pathology, toxicology or toxicologic pathology trainee. A trainee is defined as an individual working on an academic degree, in a training or residency program, or in a postdoctoral training position and have demonstrated achievements in the field of toxicologic pathology including but not limited to:

Research contributing to public safety as it relates to the adverse health effects of xenobiotics; establishing test methods and standards that enhance the field of toxicologic pathology; and/or developing new or novel uses of toxicologic pathology in safety research.

# Awards

## ESTP award for a thesis

This award consists of first, second and third prize with award certificate, prize money 1<sup>st</sup> € 2000,-, 2<sup>nd</sup> € 1500,-, 3<sup>rd</sup> € 1000,- and one year free ESTP membership. With this endowment it is attempted to promote cooperation between Universities and industry and to interest young scientists in toxicologic pathology and related fields.

Doctoral theses or PhD-theses on any aspect of toxicologic pathology, laboratory animal pathology or experimental pathology will be considered for an award. Applicants have to be enrolled in a European University. Theses have to be written in English or the applicant must be willing to arrange for translation if requested. Theses of the two previous years are considered.

Evaluation and discussion by the awards committee will be done by end of August. Presentation of the awards takes place at the yearly ESTP conference.

Since 2010, the French STP sponsors the 2 Best Poster Awards selected by the Poster Committee with a diploma and a monetary prize of € 1000,-. The aim of the SFPT is to help scientists to share their work and results to their scientific peers and to favor direct contact during the poster sessions. All posters with pathology content are eligible; however toxicologic pathology topics will be favored and one award will more specifically be offered to a young colleague. To submit a poster, please follow the description on the ESTP homepage and use the poster submission form.

**IFSTP (International Federation of Societies of Toxicologic Pathologists)** is a confederation of ten national and regional societies of toxicologic pathology (STPs) representing scientists from around the globe. The IFSTP's stated role is to build, integrate and set standards in toxicologic pathology. Its activities are controlled by the member STPs, which provide funds and volunteers to conduct IFSTP functions.

IFSTP has established a trainee award for PhD students training in toxicologic pathology. The IFSTP will fund an award in the amount of \$ 750,- USD, which can be used by the successful student for travel or registration costs to attend the ESTP conference.

This award is offered to a deserving student to attend the upcoming ESTP meeting. The successful applicant should have demonstrated achievements in the field of toxicologic pathology and should be prepared to present a poster of their work at the conference. ## *Call for Case Presentations*

Cases for oral presentation are welcome on all topics of pathology. **The deadline for submission is June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2016.**

This year, cases will be presented on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>th</sup> September, 2016. These will be interactive sessions, if possible around adversity, on interpreting pathology slides, diagnostic findings as adverse or non-adverse. This interactive session will hopefully generate lively and productive discussions, and most importantly, allow us to have a good time!

For each case, the presenter could project:

- a. a series of images from lesions,
- b. clinical and/or toxicological endpoints with potential adversity questions,

and suggest a choice of diagnoses/answers. The audience will then vote via wireless keypads, and the voting results will be displayed on the screen. After each voting session, time for discussion will be allowed.

The castell de Montjuïc offers a wide variety of culture, art, sport and parks in addition to a spectacular view over Barcelona. This touristic place can be reached by bus and metro within about 30 minutes. Those not wanting to walk up the mountain can get there by cable car.

## How to get to Barcelona, Avenida Palace Hotel

### By air

#### **Barcelona International Airport** (Barcelona-El Prat International Airport – BCN)

The Barcelona El Prat airport is located in the south of the city and is a major transport hub and flights land from all over Europe and beyond. The airport is only about 12-14 km away from the city centre.

A cheap and fast option is the half-hourly RENFE R2 Nord suburban train line calling at Sants (travel time is 18 min), Passeig de Gràcia (24 min), El Clot-Aragó (30 min) and more stations beyond Barcelona city limits. The station “Passeig de Gràcia” is only a few walking minutes away from the hotel.

The other opportunity of public transport is the aerobus. Aerobús is the city’s shuttle bus service that connects the Airport (both terminals) with the centre of Barcelona (Plaça de Catalunya), leaving every 5-10 minutes (A1), every 10-20 minutes (A2), every day of the year. The “A1” line takes you to/from Terminal 1 and the “A2” line takes you to/from Terminal 2. The shuttle bus service is available everyday from 5:30am to 1am, and the journey lasts about 30 minutes (although it can take considerably longer during rush hour). Exit at the station “Catalunya” either walk to the Hotel or take the metro to the station “Passeig de Gràcia” which is slightly a few walking minutes closer to the hotel.

The other possibility is to take the underground L9 from the airport to the station “Zona Universitaria” and then change to L3 until the station “Catalunya”.

# General information

## Nearby airports

Some low-cost carriers, notably Ryanair, use airports in Girona, nearly 100 km to the north, or Reus, around the same distance to the south, instead. Since Ryanair recently started operating at Barcelona El Prat (airport code BCN) check using the three-letter airport codes where your flight actually goes. Girona's airport code is GRO and Reus's airport code is REU.

For **Girona Airport**, the Barcelona Bus service runs a shuttle bus from Estació del Nord (which is walking distance to the Arc de Triomf metro stop) in Barcelona to Girona Airport and this ties in with various flight times. A one-way ticket costs € 16,- and a return ticket costs € 25,-. The journey takes approximately one hour and ten minutes.

From the bus station it is a short walk to the train station Arc de Triomf. Take the trains R1, R3 and R4 in the direction of Mataro to the station Catalunya. Then it is only a few walking minutes to the hotel.

For **Reus Airport**, the easiest way to get there is to take the bus run by Hispano Igualadina from the Barcelona Sants bus station to the airport. Bus departures are synchronized with Ryanair plane departures/arrivals. One way ticket costs € 13,- and a return ticket costs € 24,-. The journey takes c. 100 min, depending on the traffic on the motorway.

## Weather in Barcelona

As a coastal city at the Mediterranean Sea, Barcelona has a Mediterranean climate. During the summer it is warm, sometimes hot but dry with temperatures around 28 degrees. In winter the day temperature is around 13 degrees with more rain than in summer.

In September the average temperature has comfortable 22 to 25 degrees. The water temperature is still warm enough to go swimming in the ocean. At the evening it is getting a little bit colder but you can still sit outside.

## Language

The official language in Spain is Spanish. In Catalonia and so in Barcelona the second official language is Catalan which is the dominant language. In the rest of Spain they do not speak Catalan. In the tourism sector most people speak English.

The language of the congress is English.

# General information

## Electricity

The main voltage is 230 Volt like almost in whole Europe. The flat European standard fit into the Spanish sockets. Most Europeans do not need to buy an adapter plug for Spain. Swiss and UK citizens need an adapter!

## Currency

The currency in Spain is the Euro (€), divided into 100 Cent. Since the launch of the euro there are not that many exchange offices anymore, but credit cards are accepted almost everywhere. Note that most institutions charge a fee for the use of the card in foreign countries. Please check on your contract.

## Visa

Citizen of the EU, Switzerland, Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein do not require a visa, you can enter with a valid passport or national identity card.

## Visa Requirements

It is the sole responsibility of the attendee to take care of his / her visa requirements. Attendees who require an entry visa must allow sufficient time for the application procedure. Attendees should contact the nearest embassy or consulate to determine the appropriate timing of their visa applications. It is recommended to apply for a visa at least 3 months in advance of the Congress.
